Robin Gow, MFA | Director of the Education Institute (fae/it/he & él y elle) is a trans and queer poet and educator from Kutztown. They earned an MFA in Creative Writing from Adelphi University where they also taught for two years as an adjunct professor of English. At their undergrad, Ursinus College, Robin served as the president of the Gender and Sexuality Alliance and the Coordinator of the Rainbow Resource Center, developing events and support services for LGBTQIA+ students and advocating for more inclusive policies. Robin has given trainings on creating more inclusive spaces for trans people to colleges, healthcare networks, and schools across the country. They are the author of three poetry collections, an essay collection, and a Young Adult novel, A Million Quiet Revolutions. As an autistic person, Robin feels passionate about celebrating neurodiversity in the queer community.
