- Meeting agenda examples
 - Set priorities and establish project goals based on the identification of system gaps or needs (i.e.: creating Navigation Guides or program development/enhancement).
 - Agreement around intended outcomes and results.
 - Focus energy and resources on completing project.
 - Promotional planning to raise awareness about the resources or available program/services.
 - Assessment and monitoring the impact of resources or services.
- · Meetings are held on a quarterly basis.
- Committee members are not required to attend every meeting.
- Meetings are held in person at the Lehigh County Government Center, with virtual options available for those unable to join in person.
